It's a turn from self and sin, and a turn towards Jesus as your Lord and Savior and choosing to live God's ways.

#5) The Open Highway (Romans 10:13):

Finally, the road is open to all Romans. 10:13 reassures us: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." It doesn't matter where you've been or what you've done; salvation is available to anyone who calls upon Jesus.

Prayer
